[SATAN] All this I will give you, all this I will give you, all this I will give you if you will bow down and worship me, if you will bow down and worship me. *Jesus becomes angry at Satan and casts him away.* [JESUS (and ANGELS)] Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only. *Satan tries to come toward Jesus, but angels push him back. Satan realizes he can't win this battle and leaves.* (Worship the Lord your God) Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only. FOLLOW ME *The stage lights come up to show Simon and Andrew casting nets. They are working hard, having a difficult time and not enjoying their day. Jesus walks toward them.* [NARRATOR] As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. *Jesus stands at the shore and calls to Simon and Andrew.* [JESUS] Come, follow me, follow me, follow me, come, follow me, follow me, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. Simon and Andrew immediately drop their nets and follow Jesus. [NARRATOR] At once they left their nets and followed him. Matthew is sitting at a tax collector booth. Jesus walks toward him. Simon and Andrew are leery of Matthew because he's a despised tax collector. [NARRATOR] As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. *Simon and Andrew leave with indignation when they see that Jesus wants to associate with tax collectors. Jesus calls to Matthew.* [JESUS] Follow me, follow me, follow me, follow me, follow me, follow me, follow me. *Matthew leaves his booth and follows Jesus without caring what happens to his collected monies.* [NARRATOR] And Matthew got up and followed him. *Jesus calls more disciples. LAMB OF GOD *Jesus and his followers walk by John the Baptist, who has Andrew and another disciple around him.* [NARRATOR] The next day John was there again with two of his disciples. When he saw Jesus passing by, John the Baptist points out Jesus to his disciples. [JOHN THE BAPTIST] Look, the Lamb of God! Look, the Lamb of God! Look, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! *John the Baptist's disciples follow Jesus, who turns around and confronts them.* [NARRATOR] When the two disciples heard him say this, they followed Jesus. Turning around, Jesus saw them following and asked *Jesus speaks to one disciple and then the other, then both as he questions their intentions.* [JESUS] What do you want? What do you want? What do you want, do you want, do you want? *John the Baptist's disciples look at each other and then answer Jesus with a question.* [JOHN'S DISCIPLES and (NARRATOR)] Rabbi (which means Teacher) where are you staying? [JESUS] Come, and you will see. *John the Baptist's disciples follow Jesus.* [NARRATOR] So they went and saw where he was staying, and spent that day with him. It was about the tenth hour. Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, was one of the two who heard what John had said and who had followed Jesus. *Andrew runs off to find his brother Simon.* The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother Simon and tell him, "We have found the

Christ.” *Andrew, Simon, John the Baptist and the disciples are all following Jesus and attracting a crowd.* [ANDREW and (JOHN THE BAPTIST)] We have found the Christ. (Look, the Lamb of God!) BLESSED ARE *A large crowd begins to follow Jesus, so he leaves with his disciples to a quiet place where he sits and they join.* [NARRATOR] Now when he saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, and he began to teach them, *Jesus sings to his disciples. They are in awe of his wisdom and knowledge.* [JESUS] Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted. Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peace makers, for they will be called sons of God Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you. You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled by men. You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven. IF I JUST TOUCH HIS CLOTHES *A crowd gathers around Jesus, following him closely wherever he goes. A woman, walking in pain, tries to reach through the crowd to touch Jesus’ clothes, but can’t find any openings. The narrator is walking among the crowd and following the sick woman.* [NARRATOR] A large crowd followed and pressed around him. And a woman was there who had been subject to bleeding for twelve years. She had suffered a great deal under the care of many doctors and had spent all she had, yet instead of getting better she grew worse. When she heard about Jesus, she came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, because she thought, [SICK WOMAN] *The woman tries to touch Jesus’ cloak and misses.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. *The woman finally grabs Jesus’ cloak in her hand.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. [NARRATOR] Immediately her bleeding stopped and she felt in her body that she was freed from her suffering. At once Jesus realized that power had gone out from him. He turned around in the crowd and asked, *Jesus looks directly at the woman.* [JESUS] Who touched my clothes? *The disciples look at Jesus in disbelief.* [DISCIPLES and (NARRATOR)] You see the people crowding against you, (His disciples answered,) and yet you can ask, ‘Who touched me?’ (But Jesus said,) Jesus looks directly at the woman again. [JESUS] Someone touched me; I know that power has gone out from me. *The woman runs toward Jesus and falls at his feet in fear.* [NARRATOR] Then the woman, seeing that she could not go unnoticed, came trembling and fell at his feet. In the presence of all the people, she told why she had touched him and how she had been instantly healed. [SICK WOMAN] *The woman gets to her knees but keeps her head looking down at the ground, afraid to face Jesus.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. *The woman looks up at Jesus in awe and fear.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. *The woman looks at the crowd.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. *The woman looks to God in heaven.* If I just touch his clothes, I will be healed. THE WIND AND THE WAVES *A large crowd begins to follow Jesus again.* [NARRATOR] That day when evening came, he said to his disciples [JESUS] Let us go over to the other side.

Jesus and his disciples set out on boats. Jesus lies on a cushion at the back of the boat and falls asleep. [NARRATOR] Leaving the crowd behind, they took him along, just as he was, in the boat. There were also other boats with him. *The wind and waves become dangerous and the frightened disciples rush to wake Jesus.* A furious squall came up, and the waves broke over the boat, so that it was nearly swamped. [DISCIPLES] Oooh, oooh. Oh! Oh! Oh! [NARRATOR] Jesus was in the stern, sleeping on a cushion. The disciples woke him and said to him *Jesus' disciples wake him and cry out.* [DISCIPLES] Teacher, don't you care if we drown? Teacher, don't you care if we drown? *Jesus stands to rebukes the wind and waves, calming the storm.* [NARRATOR] He got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, [JESUS] Quiet! Be still! Quiet! Be still! [NARRATOR] Then the wind died down and it was completely calm. He said to his disciples, *Jesus rebukes his disciples for their lack of faith. The disciples are frightened over what they just witnessed.* [JESUS] Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith? [NARRATOR] They were terrified and asked each other, [DISCIPLES] Who is this? Even the wind and the waves, even the wind and the waves, even the wind and the waves obey him!

END OF THE AGE *Jesus addresses his disciples.* [JESUS and (DISCIPLES)] This is how it will be at the end of the age. The angels will come and separate the wicked from the righteous and throw them into the fiery furnace, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth. Have you understood all these things? Have you understood all these things?(Yes) Therefore every teacher of the law who has been instructed about the kingdom of heaven is like the owner of a house who brings out of his storeroom new treasures as well as old, new treasures as well as old, new treasures as well as old, new treasures as well as old. LIVING WATER *Jesus walks toward Jacob's well and sees a Samaritan woman coming to draw water.* [NARRATOR] He came to a town in Samaria. Jacob's well was there. A Samaritan woman came to draw water. [JESUS (and SAMARITAN WOMAN)] Will you give me a drink? (You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?) If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water. (Sir, you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his flocks and herds?) Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give him will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life. (Sir, give me this water so that I won't get thirsty and have to keep coming here to draw water.) Go, call your husband and come back.(I have no husband.) You are right when you say you have no husband. The fact is, you have had five husbands, and the man you now have is not your husband. What you have just said is quite true. (Sir, I can see that you are a prophet. Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, but you Jews claim that the place where we must worship is in Jerusalem.) Believe me, woman, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in spirit and in truth. (I know that Messiah is coming. When he comes, he will explain everything to us.) I who speak to you am he. *Jesus rides a donkey into Jerusalem. Crowds sing praises while laying palms leaves in his path.* [CROWD] Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna! TAXES TO CAESAR *Some holy men among the crowd look at Jesus with indignation and suspicion. They plot among themselves and send two spies to trick him with a loaded question.* [NARRATOR] Keeping a close watch on him, they sent spies, who pretended to be honest. They hoped to catch Jesus in

something he said so that they might hand him over to the power and authority of the governor. So the spies questioned him: *The two spies feign reverence for Jesus' wisdom and try to flatter him as a lure for him with a trick question.* [SPY ONE (and SPY TWO)] Teacher, we know that you speak and teach what is right (and that you do not show partiality) but teach the way of God (in accordance with the truth.) Is it right for us to pay taxes to Caesar or not? (in accordance with the truth.) Is it right for us to pay taxes to Caesar or not? *The two spies look at each other and give a wink, thinking they have tricked Jesus into giving the wrong answer no matter what it is. Jesus responds to their question with another question.* [NARRATOR] He saw through their duplicity and said to them, *Jesus addresses both spies, one-at-a-time.* [JESUS] Show me a denarius. Whose portrait and inscription are on it? *The spies take a denarius and examine it with curiosity. They answer without knowing how it relates.* Show me a denarius. Whose portrait and inscription are on it? [SPIES (and NARRATOR)] Caesar's ("Caesar's," they replied.) Caesar's ("Caesar's," they replied.) *Jesus answers with authority.* [JESUS] Then give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's. Give to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's. I AND THE FATHER *Segments of the crowd gather around Jesus feeling impatient and skeptical. They demand an immediate explanation of Jesus' identity.* [NARRATOR] Then came the Feast of Dedication at Jerusalem. It was winter, and Jesus was in the temple area walking in Solomon's Colonnade. The Jews gathered around him, *A crowd of Jews close in around Jesus.* [JEWS] How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly. How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Christ, tell us plainly. *Jesus preaches to the Jews.* [JESUS] I did tell you, but you do not believe. The miracles I do in my Father's name speak for me, but you do not believe because you are not my sheep. My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one can snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one. I and the Father are one. *The Jews become upset at Jesus' words, so they grab him to throw him off a cliff, but freeze in suspended animation as Jesus meanders between them, delivering his message before walking away.*

MY TEACHING [JESUS] My teaching is not my own. It comes from him who sent me. If anyone chooses to do God's will, he will find out whether my teaching comes from God or whether I speak on my own. He who speaks on his own does so to gain honor for himself, but he who works for the honor of the one who sent him is a man of truth; there is nothing false about him. Has not Moses given you the law? Yet not one of you keeps the law. Why are you trying to kill me? Why are you trying to kill me? Why are you trying to kill me? Why are you trying to kill me? But when the Jewish Feast of Tabernacles was near, Jesus' brothers said to him, *Jesus' brothers plead their case to Jesus.* [BROTHERS] You ought to leave here and go to Judea, so that your disciples may see the miracles you do. No one who wants to become a public figure acts in secret. Since you are doing these things, show yourself to the world. Since you are doing these things, show yourself to the world. *Jesus speaks to his brothers.* [JESUS] The right time for me has not yet come; for you any time is right. The world cannot hate you, but it hates me because I testify that what it does is evil. You go to the Feast. I am not yet going up to this Feast, because for me the right time has not yet come, for me the right time has not yet come, has not yet come, has not yet come.

(END OF ACT ONE)

WHAT SHE HAS DONE *Jesus and his disciples are in the home of Simon the Leper. The narrator joins the disciples at the table. [NARRATOR] While Jesus was in Bethany in the home of a man known as Simon the Leper, A woman enters with an alabaster jar of expensive perfume that she pours on Jesus' head. a woman came to him with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume, which she poured on his head as he was reclining at the table. Judas becomes upset because Jesus allows the perfume to be wasted. When the disciples saw this, they were indignant. [JUDAS and DISCIPLES] The disciples address the woman. Why this waste? SATAN ENTERED JUDAS *Judas leaves in anger. He goes to the Temple to meet with the chief priests with the intention of betraying Jesus. The narrator follows Judas. Satan enters and walks with Judas. [NARRATOR] Now the Feast of Unleavened Bread, called the Passover, was approaching, and the chief priests and the teachers of the law were looking for some way to get rid of Jesus, for they were afraid of the people, for they were afraid of the people. Satan lays his hands on Judas and causes him to react violently, as if her were being electrocuted. Then Satan entered Judas, called Iscariot, one of the Twelve. Judas becomes possessed and displays Satan's mannerisms and movements in his personality. Satan stands in the distance, directing Judas with motions of his hands. And Judas went to the chief priests and the officers of the temple guard and discussed with them how he might betray Jesus, and discussed with them how he might betray Jesus. Judas is rubbing his hands together and has a wide-eyed greediness, anticipating wealth. Satan is mirroring Judas' movements in the background, as if he is controlling his every thought and motion. The chief priests hold out their hands and welcome Judas into their fold. Satan leans back against a wall and crosses his arms and legs, smiling with contentment. They were delighted and agreed to give him money. He consented, and watched for an opportunity to hand Jesus over to them when no crowd was present. When no crowd was present. The stage lights fade to a blackout, with a solo spot on the narrator, who has moved to the proscenium. The lights come up to the Last Supper.*

IN REMEMBRANCE *Jesus raises his hands to heaven in prayer, then the disciples begin to eat. Jesus takes bread and breaks it, handing it to his disciples. [NARRATOR] While they were eating, Jesus took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, [JESUS] Take and eat; this is my body. Take and eat; this is my body. [NARRATOR] Then he took the cup, gave thanks and offered it to them, saying, [JESUS] Drink from it, all of you. This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it anew with you, until that day when I drink it anew with you in my Father's kingdom.*

TO SERVE [NARRATOR] Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him. *Jesus addresses the mother. [JESUS] What is it you want? What is it you want? Jesus addresses her sons. What is it you want? What is it you want? The mother kneels at Jesus' feet and pleads with him. [ZEBEDEE'S WIFE] Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom, in your kingdom. Sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom. Jesus lifts the woman to her feet and sends her away. [JESUS] You don't know what you are asking, Jesus questions one of her sons. the cup? *The sons look at each other with agreement.* [ZEBEDEE'S SONS] We can, *The sons look at Jesus with confidence.* we can. *Jesus places his arms around their shoulders, one at each of his sides. The rest of Jesus' disciples enter. The narrator and Judas join them around Jesus. Zebedee's mother sets bread at the table.* [JESUS] You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father. *Judas looks at the two disciples with indignation and gossips among the rest, causing a stir of emotions.* [NARRATOR] When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers. Jesus called them together and said, *Jesus motions for his disciples to join him. They gather around the table and listen attentively to Jesus' every word, anticipating a rank of discipleship. Jesus instead teaches them the requirement to serve.* [JESUS] You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slave-- just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. The narrator is walking behind them.*

TAKE THIS CUP [NARRATOR] Jesus went out as usual to the Mount of Olives, and his disciples followed him. On reaching the place, he said to them, *Jesus raises his hand to stop the disciples from following him any further.* [JESUS] Pray that you will not fall into temptation. *The disciples begin to pray together while Jesus walks off with the narrator following behind him.* Pray that you will not fall into temptation. [NARRATOR] He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, *Jesus falls to his knees and stretches his arms to heaven.* [JESUS] Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done. *Jesus falls to his face and stretches his arms before him.* Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done, *Jesus rises to his knees, face down.* not my will, but yours be done, *Jesus rises to his feet, head up.* not my will, but yours be done, not my will, but yours be done. *Jesus returns to his disciples, who are sleeping. A crowd comes up carrying clubs and swords and surrounds Jesus and his disciples. The disciples jump to their feet and Judas goes to kiss Jesus on his cheeks. Jesus looks at Judas.*

WHEN DARKNESS REIGNS [NARRATOR] When he rose from prayer, and went back to his disciples, he found them asleep. A crowd came up and the man who was called Judas, approached Jesus to kiss him. [JESUS] Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss? *A disciple lifts a sword in defense but Jesus stops him.* No more of this! *Jesus speaks to the crowd.* Am I leading a rebellion, that you have come with swords and clubs? Every day I was with you in the temple courts, and you did not lay a hand on me. But this is your hour--when darkness reigns. This is your hour--when darkness reigns. *During the music interlude, Jesus is bound and sent to Caiaphas. Peter follows at a distance.*

NO REPLY [NARRATOR] Those who had arrested Jesus took him to Caiaphas. Peter followed him at a distance, right up to the courtyard of the high priest. He sat down with the guards to see the outcome. The chief priest and Sanhedrin were looking for false evidence so that they could put him to death. But they did not find any, though false witnesses came. The high priest stood up and said [CAIAPHAS] Are you not going to answer? Are you not going to answer? Are you not going to answer? Answer! [NARRATOR] Jesus remained silent. The high priest said to him, [CAIAPHAS (and JESUS)] I charge you by the Living God: Tell us if you are the Christ, the Son of God. (Yes, it is as you say.) He is worthy of death! He is worthy of death! *Jesus is bound and sent to Pilate.* [NARRATOR] They bound Jesus, led him away and handed him to Pilate. Jesus stood before the governor. [PONTIUS PILATE (and JESUS)] Are you the king of the Jews? (Yes, it is as you say.) Are you the king of the Jews? (It is as you say, it is as you say.) Don't you hear the testimony they are bringing against you? [NARRATOR] But Jesus made no reply. Jesus made no reply. Jesus made no reply.

CRUCIFY HIM! *Jesus is led with Barrabas before a crowd. Both stand beside Pontius Pilate who addresses the crowd.* [PONTIUS PILATE] What shall I do, then, with Jesus who is called Christ, who is called Christ? [NARRATOR] Pilate asked. They all answered, *The crowd answers in unison, raising their fists.* [CROWD] Crucify him! [PONTIUS PILATE] Why? What crime has he committed? [NARRATOR] But they shouted all the louder, *The crowd answers in unison again.* [CROWD] Crucify him! *Pilate gives up trying to talk sense into the crowd and washes his hands in a bowl of water.* [NARRATOR] When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but that instead an uproar was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. [PONTIUS PILATE] I am innocent of this man's blood. It is your responsibility! [NARRATOR] All the people answered, *The crowd answers in unison again.* [CROWD] Let his blood be on us and on our children! *Pilate releases Barabbas and has the soldiers flog Jesus.* [NARRATOR] Then he released Barabbas to them. But he had Jesus flogged, and handed him over to be crucified. *The soldiers lead Jesus away and gather in a circle around him, shielding him from the audience's view.* [NARRATOR] Then the governor's soldiers took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole company of soldiers around him. They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, and then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head. They put a staff in his right hand and knelt in front of him and mocked him. *The soldiers kneel down in front of Jesus, who has a scarlet robe, crown of thorns and a staff.* [SOLDIERS] Hail, king of the Jews! *The soldiers get up laughing and spit at Jesus, hitting him on the head with a staff.* [NARRATOR] They said. They spit on him, and took the staff and struck him on the head again and again. *The soldiers remove the scarlet robe and toss Jesus' cloak to him.* After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. *The soldiers place a cross on Jesus' shoulders. A crowd follows that includes weeping women.* Then they led him away to crucify him. Then they led him away to crucify him. *During the music introduction, women are crying and following Jesus, who falls down. The soldiers grab Simon the Cerene and force him to carry Jesus' cross. Jesus turns to the weeping women as he slowly walks toward his crucifixion.*

DAUGHTERS OF JERUSALEM [JESUS] Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep for yourselves and for your children. For the time will come when you will say, 'Blessed are the barren women, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!' Then 'they will say to the mountains, "Fall on us!" and to the hills, "Cover us!"' For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry? For if men do these things when the tree is green, what will happen when it is dry? *Jesus continues behind the man who is carrying Jesus' cross. The women are weeping and reaching out towards Jesus. He turns to them and repeats himself.* Daughters of Jerusalem, Daughters of Jerusalem, Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me.

PARADISE [NARRATOR] Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with him to be executed. When they came to the place called the Skull, there they crucified him, along with the criminals--one on his right, the other on his left. Jesus said, *Jesus cries out to heaven.* [JESUS] Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing. *The soldiers nail Jesus to the cross and lift it into position, along with the two criminals.* [NARRATOR] One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him: *The criminal mocks Jesus in disbelief.* [CRIMINAL ONE] Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us! [NARRATOR] But the other criminal rebuked him. *The second criminal shames the first criminal into silence and sorrow.* [CRIMINAL TWO] Don't you fear God, since you are under the same sentence? We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong. *The second criminal turns to Jesus, seeking mercy and forgiveness* [NARRATOR] Then he said. [CRIMINAL TWO] Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom. [NARRATOR] Jesus answered him. [JESUS] I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise. IT IS FINISHED *Mary (the mother of Jesus) and a disciple stand at Jesus' feet at the cross. Jesus turns to his mother.* [NARRATOR] Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother and the disciple whom he loved.

[JESUS] Dear woman, here is your son. *Jesus turns to the disciple.* Here is your mother. *Jesus turns to the Roman soldiers.* I am thirsty. *The soldiers dip a sponge in a jar and raise it to Jesus' lips by sticking it on a spear.* [NARRATOR] A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it and lifted it to Jesus' lips. *Jesus turns his head away from the sponge and looks up to heaven.* [JESUS] My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Father, into your hands I commit my spirit. It is finished. It is finished. *Jesus releases his final breath and dies on the cross. The stage lights are blacked out during a brief music interlude, lights gradually fade up to reveal a tomb with a large stone rolled away. There is only a burial cloth where Jesus' body had been. There is 30 seconds of darkness with a deep synthesizer sound. When the next song begins, women disciples come to the tomb with spice jars.*

EARLY IN THE MORNING [NARRATOR] On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. *Two angels dressed in white appear to the women and they fall down in fright.* While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, *The angels gently assure the women they have nothing to fear.* [ANGELS] Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again. WHY ARE YOU CRYING? *The angels sit down at the head and foot of Jesus' burial cloth while the women run off in surprise. Mary Magdalene stays at the tomb, crying.* [NARRATOR] Then the disciples went back to their homes, but Mary stood outside the tomb crying. *Mary Magdalene looks up and sees the angels by Jesus' burial cloth.* As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. They asked her, *The angels turn to Mary.* [ANGELS] Woman, why are you crying? Why are you crying? Woman, why are you crying? Why are you crying? *Mary Magdalene answers the angels with grief and worry.* [MARY MAGDALENE] They have taken my Lord away, and I don't know where they have put him. They have taken my Lord away, and I don't know where they have put him. *Mary Magdalene turns around and sees Jesus standing with his back to her in the middle of a garden, with a hood over his head.* [NARRATOR] At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. *Jesus doesn't look at Mary.* [JESUS] Woman, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for? Why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for? [NARRATOR] thinking he was the gardener, she said, *Mary slowly walks toward Jesus.* [MARY M.] Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him. *Jesus turns around to face Mary and removes his hood.* [NARRATOR] Jesus said to her, [JESUS] Mary. *Mary turns to face Jesus.* Mary. [NARRATOR] She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, *Mary looks at Jesus in disbelief, then runs to hold him tightly.* [MARY M.] Rabboni! Rabboni! Rabboni! *Jesus backs away from Mary and sends her to the disciples.* [JESUS] Do not hold on to me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' *Mary runs off to the front of the stage, facing the audience as if they were Jesus' disciples.* [NARRATOR] Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: [MARY MAGDALENE and (NARRATOR)] I have seen the Lord!" (And she told them that he) I have seen the Lord!" (had said these things to her.) I have seen the Lord!" *The stage lights fade to black while the music introduction for the next song begins. A light comes up on the narrator, who is walking with a man and woman.*

THE ROAD TO EMMAUS [NARRATOR] Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles from Jerusalem. They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. *Jesus walks along side them.* As they talked and discussed these things with each

other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; but they were kept from recognizing him. [JESUS] What are you discussing together as you walk along? *The couple stops walking and turn toward Jesus.* [NARRATOR] They stood still, their faces downcast. One of them, named Cleopas, asked him, [CLEOPAS AND WIFE] Are you only a visitor to Jerusalem and do not know the things that have happened there in these days? [JESUS] What things? [CLEOPAS AND WIFE] About Jesus of Nazareth. He was a prophet, powerful in word and deed before God and all the people. The chief priests and our rulers handed him over to be sentenced to death, and they crucified him; but we had hoped that he was the one who was going to redeem Israel. And what is more, it is the third day since all this took place. In addition, some of our women amazed us. They went to the tomb early this morning but didn't find his body. They came and told us that they had seen a vision of angels, who said he was alive. Then some of our companions went to the tomb and found it just as the women had said, but him they did not see. *Jesus can't believe that they still don't understand the Scriptures.* [JESUS] How foolish you are, and how slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Did not the Christ have to suffer these things and then enter his glory? [NARRATOR] And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them what was said in all the Scriptures concerning himself. *Jesus explains Scripture to the couple.* As they approached the village to which they were going, Jesus acted as if he were going farther. But they urged him strongly, *Cleopas takes Jesus by the arm.* [CLEOPAS AND WIFE] Stay with us, for it is nearly evening; the day is almost over. *Jesus agrees and enters the house and sits at the table with them. Cleopas' wife offers bread to Jesus, who prays to heaven and breaks the bread.* [NARRATOR] So he went in to stay with them. When he was at the table with them, he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them. *The couple recognizes Jesus just as he disappears.* Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, *The couple turn to each other in amazement.* [CLEOPAS AND HIS WIFE] Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us? *The couple jumps up excitedly and run offstage.* [NARRATOR] They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. *A group of disciples are sitting together in a room, excitedly talking to each other. Jesus enters the room and he shows them the marks in his hands and feet.*

WHAT IS WRITTEN [NARRATOR] Jesus himself stood among them, he showed them his hands and feet. He opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. [JESUS] This is what is written, this is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high. *Jesus leads them to the vicinity of Bethany, where he blesses them and is taken up into heaven.*

PRAISING GOD [NARRATOR] When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven, taken up into heaven. Then they worshiped him, then they worshiped him, then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God, praising God, praising God. *The disciples are praying together in one room when a wind startles them.*

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN? [NARRATOR] When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house *Flaming tongues separate and rest on each disciple, causing them to speak in foreign tongues.* They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them, as the Spirit enabled them, as the Spirit enabled them, as the Spirit enabled them. *A crowd of Jews notice the commotion gather around.* Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. This man was handed over to you by God's set purpose and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. David said about him: *King David appears as an apparition.* [DAVID] I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices, and my tongue rejoices; my body also will live in hope, because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, fill me with joy in your presence. [PETER] Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day, his tomb is here to this day. But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. Seeing what was ahead, he spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to the grave, nor did his body see decay. God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact, we are all witnesses of the fact. Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said, [DAVID] The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet, a footstool for your feet. [PETER] Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ.
